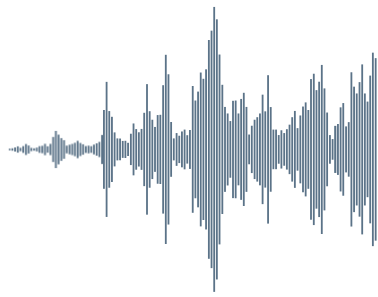

Symptoms of hearing loss:

- Turning up the TV or radio louder than others
- Asking spouse, family or friends to repeat frequently
- Thinking everyone mumbles
- Avoiding activities because they can't hear
- Difficulty hearing in a crowd
- Ringing in the ears

Research shows that hearing loss is very common in adults over 60 and that on average, individuals take between 5-7 years to do something about their hearing loss. Research also supports better success with improving your hearing the sooner that you treat the hearing loss because the brain needs sound stimulation!

*RECENT RESEARCH (October 2015) shows that there is **reduced cognitive decline** in seniors who wear hearing aids - if needed - than in those who don't (University of Bordeaux, France).*

What to do if patients experience some of these symptoms:

1. Recommend they have their hearing examined by a hearing healthcare professional

- Refer to AHS-waiting time is approximately 6 months), or arrange a test through an Audiology clinic.
